

NIH K Award Tutorial

In anticipation of the **February 12, 2017** deadline for the NIH K Career Development Award for new proposals, the Office of Postdoctoral Education will be offering an NIH K Grant Writing Course.

What will be covered: The series will address the following K Award categories: K01, K07, K08, K22, K23, K25, K99/00 as well as VA CDA and other career development awards. The classes will include didactic presentation, discussion, and Q&A. Time permitting, Dr. Janet Gross will provide an individual read and review of your proposal.

When and where (This is a 2 class series, attending both is highly recommended):

Class 1: Monday, November 21, 9:00am-12:30pm (SOM Rm. 190P)

Class 2: Monday, November 28, 9:30am-12:00pm (SOM Rm. 190P)

Who should attend?

- This series is open to all Postdocs, Instructors, Assistant Professors (and equivalent)
- Candidates submitting revised (A1) proposals for the **next K** deadline may attend.
- Please note that the K99 has no US citizenship restriction. Additionally K99 application must be submitted before reaching 4 year anniversary as Postdoc
- If you are planning to submit a grant proposal within the next 6-9 months – you should attend! We have learned from experience (over 160 grants submitted by students in our program) that early planning is a key to success
- We are happy to have candidates who are planning for any kind of NIH K, VA CDA, or other Career Development or Young Investigator award

How to enroll in the course?

To enroll, email Dr. Janet Gross at jsgros2@emory.edu **ASAP**, along with the following required information:

1. Biographical sketch following the specific instructions for K series Career Development Awards (see special K instructions in the Application Guidelines, section 7.)
2. Title of project (200 characters max, including spaces and punctuation)
3. Current position at Emory – must include your official title, lab, mentor, year postdoc began, or year your current rank began
4. Award category (e.g., K01) and NIH Institute (e.g., NCI)
